

BOOK CLUB



The Book Club will be discussing *That Hideous Strength: A Modern Fairy-Tale for Grown-Ups,* by C. S. Lewis, on Wednesday, May 29th at 6:30pm in the Library. Copies of this book are available to check out at Dahlonega's local Library.

Now, the dark forces that have been repulsed in Out of the Silent Planet and Perelandra are massed for an assault on planet Earth. Word is that the mighty wizard Merlin has come back to the land of the living after many centuries, holding the key to ultimate power for the force that can find him and bend him to its will. A sinister technocratic organization is gaining power throughout Europe, with a plan to "recondition" society, and it is up to Ransom and his friends to stop this threat by applying age-old wisdom to a new universe dominated by science. The two groups struggle to a climactic resolution that brings the Space Trilogy to a magnificent, crashing conclusion.

Written during the dark hours immediately before and during World War II, C.S. Lewis's Space Trilogy stands alongside such works as Albert Camus's The Plague and George Orwell's 1984 as a timeless classic, beloved by succeeding generations as much for the sheer wonder of its storytelling as for the significance of its moral concerns.

MISSION TRIPS – BRIEF REPORTS AND UPCOMING OPPORTUNITIES

This is a busy and exciting year for Mission Trips to El Salvador! God is really moving! And there's proof that there is something for every-



one! We had a group of age 60+ folks (with one younger exception) go in February, who accomplished a lot: Establishing a Library, thanks to a partnership with the Sunrise Rotary Club, including delivering library books, building shelves for the Library, painting a mural on the Library wall; delivering the first batch of letters from Spon-



sors to their sponsored children; delivering letters to the children written by students of Blackburn Elementary School; doing crafts with the children and adults; helping establish a women's Bible study group to meet regularly; meeting with the staff and teachers of the school; and so much more!



And Nathan led a group of Wesley students to El Salvador in March, including a couple of adults; Pastor Steve and Andrew Myers. They worked mainly in construction of the bathrooms of the new classroom building (currently under construction). A very exciting thing was that Andrew and Rae Lynn were able



to deliver copies of Vanessa's children's devotional book, "Breakfast With Jesus" to the children!

And both groups participated in church ministry, and interacted with the children of the school and people in the community, including visiting and prayer. Most important was that each missionary allowed God to work through them to be the hands, feet, and heart of God to the precious people of La Magdalena. And each missionary was blessed beyond measure from the experience. For the college-age students, a trip like this can be life-changing.





Several people have expressed interest in going to El Salvador this year. So we are in the process of planning a trip in the summer – probably for a week in July. This will be construction and other things. And we are looking at doing a shorter trip in early November, with the central attraction being the graduations of the children – K6 (entering 1st grade next year) and 9th grade (entering high school next year). Exact dates will be set very soon. Pray about it, and if God is calling you to go serve, let Him make the way! One Child El Salvador, Inc. has a new initiative to financially support the school in La Magdalena, El Salvador. One




Child Coffee is high-quality, small-batch, artisan, singlesource coffee grown high in the mountains of El Salvador. We support sustainable coffee growing and
