Wesley Dinner Bell Schedule



Community Helping Place, Spirit of Christmas

Last year our average families served 263; this year, so far, is 223 families. 

REPORT FROM THE MISSION FIELD – NOVEMBER 2024 TRIP

We have just returned from our all-ladies November Mission Trip to El Salvador. It was, as always, a blessed time, both for the missionaries, and the people we served. Yes, we accomplished many good things, but the best part was the relationship building, and the spiritual growth that God always does in the hearts and spirits of the mission team members. This was the first trip for two of the team members. As one of the "newbies" said, "It has been an amazing journey witnessing the power of prayer. And the bonus was building memories and new friendships!" And one of our team members got the opportunity to meet her sponsored child.

As for the "doing", we took part in the graduation ceremonies for the precious K6 children on Thursday, and the 9th graders on Friday. The older kids will continue on to high school, but we learned that it is a tradition to have this transitional graduation. It is so wonderful to see the fruit of this ongoing ministry, knowing that these children will have choices for their futures, affecting them, their families, and the community of La Magdalena!



We were also blessed to take part in several ministry opportunities. We visited the children's wards



of the San Juan de Dios Hospital in Santa Ana, passing out heart pillows made by DMC's Sewing Heart Circle to the children, as well as giving pocket crosses made by Debbie Gaines and lunches we provided to the parents (they have to bring their own food, but most can't afford food, or don't want to leave the sides of their children). And we, of course, prayed with children and parents when we could. We were told by the doctor who arranged this that our being allowed to do this was a miracle in itself, as the administrator doesn't usually allow such group ministry visits.



We also delivered 18 laptop computers to teachers that were provided by the Dahlonega Sunrise Rotary. These computers will be a huge asset next year in propelling the ability of our school's teachers to a higher level in their teaching.

Other ministry opportunities included taking part in and giving the message at two church services, as well as having a meeting with the women of the church. Linda Gilreath brought another batch of books to be used in their ongoing regular meetings





and Bible study that Linda helped to launch earlier this year. We also did some visitation and prayer in the community.

Please listen for God's calling and consider going on a mission trip soon. There are many opportunities, including a construction trip coming up soon! **YOU WILL BE BLESSED!**
