Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the years, people have asked me how to know that they are walking in the way that leads to life that Jesus talked about - the straight and narrow way. One of the great evidences in your life is your ability to be able to forgive others.

Forgiveness is such a divine undertaking, that I would hazard to say that it cannot be done without the power of God working in us. On the one hand, forgiveness feels a lot like allowing injustice to occur to ourselves and our souls cry out for justice when we feel that someone is treated us unfairly. On the other hand, as saved sinners who have become temples of the living God we hear Jesus leading us to forgive when someone has treated us unjustly. This feels unfair, yet its very unfairness is what requires forgiveness. In other words, forgiveness is only appropriate in an instance of injustice.

Jesus calls us to the highest standard – His standard. If that seems inhuman to you, then you're correct. Only God can rise to the level of forgiveness that Jesus calls us toward, and we are able to forgive only because we have His Spirit living and guiding us. Jesus teaches that there is a cosmic aspect of every conflict that we encounter, "Peter came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?' Jesus answered, 'I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times. Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go. But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded. His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.' But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened. Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart." (Matthew 18:21-35). It is God's great mercy for us that should empower us to be able to forgive others. Peter learned that lesson well, as he later wrote that when we don't allow God's forgiveness to pour through us it is as if we are "nearsighted and blind, forgetting that [we] have been cleansed from [our] past sins." (2 Peter 1:9). Selah, Steve



Have you ever wondered what it would be like to live during the time that Jesus was alive? Then join the Globetrotters as we travel to LaGrange, GA, to the **Biblical History Center**, for a 1st century meal and tour on **Saturday, May 17**.

The Biblical Meal is a four-course meal consisting of 15 different food items, including soup, salad, fruit, main course, dessert and all beverages, (grape juice, or water). Your guide will explain ancient meal practices including Passover and the Last Supper, and the setting of the table for reconciliation.

The highlight of any visit to the Biblical History Center is a walk through the archaeological replica garden where full-scale reconstructions of structures relevant to daily life in Biblical times bring history to life. Four areas of ancient life are represented in our Archaeological Replica Garden: Life of the Shepherd, Life of the Farmer, Life of the Village, and Roman Theater and Market Street.

We will *depart* the Walmart parking lot at 9:00 am on the church bus. The meal will be first, followed by the tour, for a total of 3 hours at the center. We will then drive to Frank's Family Restaurant, in Palmetto, for dinner, (<u>frankspalmetto.com/home</u>), returning to the parking lot that evening. It will be a fun, full day of fellowship and learning. The center is completely handicap accessible, and we will need to know any dietary restrictions or food allergies. <u>CHP Summer Food Program</u> Outreach Mission Opportunities June 25th and July 16th from 10-1

Every summer CHP has a summer food program for school aged children that live in Lumpkin County and attend LC schools, that receive free or reduced breakfast & lunch during the school year. During the summer these families have added expenses, such as childcare and buying additional food. This program is designed to provide breakfast, lunch and snacks throughout the summer just as they received during the school year.

Volunteers are needed on June 25th and July 16th at CHP for the distribution of the food.

How it works:

The drive-thru event is 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. The first time volunteers should come 15 minutes early to learn what to do. If it is their second time volunteering, they can arrive by 9:55.


One person will have the list of families that have pre-registered. Each family will be assigned a number, the volunteer will meet the clients at their car, call out the number to the person with the list. That volunteer will tell the other 3 people how many are in the household. Then one or more of those volunteers will collect the appropriate food for that household, will bring it to their car and put it in the car.
