
Achasta Ladies Bible Study

Many people will remember Eric Liddell as the Olympic gold medalist from the Academy Award winning film Chariots of Fire. Famously, Liddell would not run on Sunday because of his strict observance of the Christian sabbath, and so he did not compete in his signature event, the 100 meters, at the 1924 Paris Olympics. He was the greatest sprinter in the world at the time, and his choice not to run was ridiculed by the British Olympic committee, his fellow athletes, and most of the world press. Yet Liddell triumphed in a new event, winning the 400 meters in Paris.

Liddell ran—and lived—for the glory of his God. After winning gold, he dedicated himself to missionary work. He travelled to China to work in a local school and as a missionary. He married and had children there. Once imprisoned, Liddell did what he was born to do, practice his faith and his sport. He became the moral center of an unbearable world.

Church Operating Budget Update

Dear Church:

Last month the finance committee revisited our current operating budget and took proactive measures to amend our budget to reflect a reallocation of our resources.

We are encouraged that our church continues to receive contributions at the same pace as 2024 and by amending the church budget we can ensure that the church's financial resources are used effectively and wisely, consistent with our church's mission.

We are called to be good stewards of our trusted resources. Therefore, last month we met with ministry leaders and requested that each ministry review their current line-item budget and look for ways they could trim expenses without impacting negatively on their ministry and programs.

Accordingly, the Finance Committee prayerfully and unanimously approved a 6% reduction in our budgeted revenue for FY 25.

Our amended budget still reflects an overall 6% increase in giving and we trust God will provide and that we will be able to meet our revised giving numbers. And, it is important to note that our church is blessed to be in a sound fiscal position.

The revised YTD budget and giving will be reflected each Sunday in our church bulletin and it is updated monthly.

Please take a moment, each Sunday, to review this information. And, continue to spend time in prayer about our church, its vision and how we can use our resources to answer Gods' call to serve his kingdom.
