

### **Celebrating the Good Samaritan Ministry**



One of the most important theologians of the twentieth century illuminates the relationship between ourselves and the teachings of Jesus

What can the call to discipleship, the adherence to the word of Jesus, mean today to the businessman, the soldier, the laborer, or the aristocrat? What did Jesus mean to say to us? What is his will for us today? Drawing on the Sermon on the Mount, Dietrich Bonhoeffer answers these timeless questions by providing a seminal reading of the dichotomy between "cheap grace" and "costly grace." "Cheap grace," Bonhoeffer wrote, "is the grace we bestow on ourselves...grace without discipleship....Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the girl which must be asked for, the door at which a man must know....It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life."

After November 30th, please take your UNWRAPPED gifts and donations directly to CHP. CHP will begin packing all the food and gifts for each family Monday, December 1st, therefore they need these unwrapped gifts delivered this date.

#### FOOD and PERSONAL CARE PANTRY STAPLES NEEDED

The number of people needing the food pantry has increased. Last year we served, on average, 270 families each month. This year we are serving an average of 300 families per month. On top of that, the amount of food we are able to receive from the food banks has decreased. I say this so you are aware that the need is greater now and keeping up with the demand is more challenging. If you are able to donate anything to our Food Pantry, we would be grateful. Items especially needed are canned meats, fruits and vegetables, pasta sauce, peanut butter, jelly, macaroni and cheese.

Due to the generous giving the food pantry is not in need of donations. However, the personal care panty could use this following: Shampoo, Conditioner, Body Wash, Toothpaste, Deodorant. Donations may be placed in the collection bin located in the hall outside the Fellowship Hall.

# Czech Republic Mission

## "Teaching English, Sharing Jesus: A Mission to Czechia"

English is the primary language of commerce and tourism throughout the globe. Consequently, people throughout the world go to great lengths to learn my native tongue.

The people of the Czech Republic are no different, taking English classes in school, and many attend English camps in the summer to improve their fluency.

When the opportunity arose for DMC to lead one such camp in the old mining town of Jachymov in the hills north of Pilsen, Pastor Robin jumped at the opportunity.

While our primary role was to teach English, the deeper purpose was to present the gospel to kids in one of the most atheistic countries in the world.

We were excited, but not sure what to expect. Most of the mission trips we'd been on involved construction or VBS. This was different.

It would involve hours of research and planning, developing a rigorous curriculum for English language learners, coming up with engaging activities to teach vocabulary, grammar, cultural concepts, and conversational skills for sixteen students.

Evangelicka Cirkev Metodisticka Pilsen, ECM Pilsen for short, hosted this week-long camp. Our job as facilitators was to teach a full day of English lessons, and facilitate a time of testimony and worship alongside Pastor Milan Mrazek.



At first our conversations were a bit awkward and surface-level. As the week progressed and we got to know each other, many students were intrigued and emotionally impacted by our testimonies. Some heard the gospel for the very first time. They asked difficult questions. They talked about their hang-ups with God, the ways in which Christians had hurt them, and even asked deeper philosophical questions. We often spoke with students late into the night, doing our best to answer their often difficult questions, admitting when we didn't have an answer, and more importantly, simply listening.

Some conversations were more light-hearted, like one with Veronika, a Ukrainian refugee, who could not believe that we'd never seen a hedgehog. Or the conversation with Pastor Milan, who had just learned the idiomatic euphemism, "see a man about a horse." Or the uproarious laughter as the American team botched the Czech tongue twister, "Strč prst skrz krk."

The last night of camp was especially memorable. Our group of once strangers, now friends, spent the night singing, listening to testimony, praying, conversing, exchanging contacts, taking pictures, and savoring our last moments together.



The next morning, parents arrived to pick up campers. Tears were shed, and hopes of reunification expressed.

God moved among the Czech youth and many have been attending the youth group at ECM Pilsen since then. Thanks to technology, each of DMC team members are in weekly, if not daily, communication with someone from camp.

Our time in Czechia left an indelible impression on each of us. Each DMC team member will tell you that there is not a day that goes by that they don't long to be back at camp with our Czech friends because of the genuine connection made possible by the Holy Spirit.
