Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During the 1992 Los Angeles riots after the Rodney King verdict, a trucker named Reginald Denny was pulled from his vehicle and severely beaten by four men. This was caught on video which resulted in their capture and subsequent trial. During and after the trial, Denny surprised the Nation by speaking on behalf of his attackers, publicly forgiving them and hugging their families afterwards. Some in the media even speculated that Denny was suffering from brain damage. Such is the shock of real forgiveness.

Such is the kind of forgiveness that we need now in our fractured time in 2026. We seem to have taken on identities based upon real and perceived harm that others have inflicted on us. This resentment-based understanding of our history and identity leads us to continually be caught in a spiral of anger, frustration and vengeance; every day is a new outrage. Forgiveness is God's gift to us to lift us out of this destructive spiral for the sake of our spiritual and emotional health. We seemingly don't understand that when we forgive others, it is we who are set free.

The problem is we have trouble forgiving others if they don't first come to us and apologize. Most of us forgive in a spirit of reciprocity; if someone is sufficiently contrite, we will forgive. But for us to initiate forgiveness when we have been the injured party seems to border on being unjust. We think, "*Why should I, the person who was hurt in this matter, be the one to initiate any reconciling action?*" Yet this is precisely what Jesus calls us to do! He asks us to pray that God forgives our sins "as we forgive those who sin against us." That is not a prayer about limiting God's grace for us, but is about us extending grace to our fellow human beings the way the God does. Through our prayers, God can lead us to become forgivers (extend grace to others) as we have been forgiven (received grace from God). Christ died for us while we were sinners. We bear witness to God's grace for us in how we extend grace to others. Freely we have received, freely give. That is certainly good news that the World needs to experience. Selah.

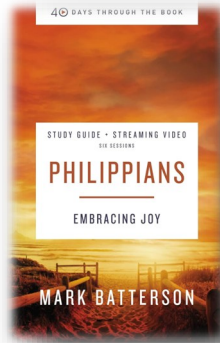

Globetrotters

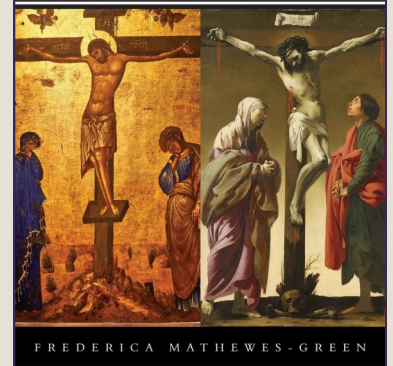

The contrast between those views is suggested by the two images on the book's cover, showing how differently the meaning of the Cross was understood, East and West. *Two Views of the Cross* is a short, focused book, ideal for readers looking to grasp the overall picture (with some passages from Mathewes-Green's more-comprehensive classic, *Welcome to the Orthodox Church*)

From Dahlonega, Georgia, to Kyiv, Ukraine, This little heart pillow carried love and hope

Dahlonega Methodist Church has a group of devoted ladies who purchase material, cut it into hearts, make a pocket, sew it together, add embellishments and present them to people who need a little love, hope, courage, and a reminder God loves them.

One such pillow was sent to Nadiia in Ukraine. How in the world did this happen? Well, I have been a recipient of a heart pillow when my daughter died. My cousin, Dr. Jan Massingill was head of curriculum for the Barrow County schools in 2015. A sweet lady named Nadiia was working there at the school while working towards her citizenship in America. She and Jan became friends as Jan learned her story. Around 2018, Nadiia's mother in Ukraine became sick, so she had to return. She was so proud THAT SHE HAD OBTAINED HER US CITIZENSHIP WHILE HERE.

Back in Ukraine, things were very hard. Dr. Jan would collect necessities and send them to Nadiia; but the process was long and expensive so out of necessity, the packages were rare. Nadiia only had water and electricity 3 hours per day but those hours were during the day when she was working at the factory. Dr. Jan sent a little camping stove (one eye) along with some canned foods to try and sustain her. In one of those packages, she included one of the pillows from the Sewing Hearts Circle that I had obtained. That Pillow, as always, included a bookmark tucked into the little pocket on the front of the pillow. It reads: Trust in Him at all times, pour out your heart to Him for God is our refuge. Psalms 62:8 On the reverse side it reads: This pillow was stuffed with love by the women of the Sewing Hearts Circle. Dahlonega Methodist Church, Park St., Dahlonega, Ga. We never dreamed of the significant impact it would have. Nadiia treasured it; clinging to it each night as she heard the bombs blasting and the guns shooting. It was a treasured possession. After her mom died and she was able to return to the USA, she was only allowed to carry one tiny satchel forcing her to leave the pillow behind. She told Jan with tears in her voice. Of course, Jan called me to see if I could procure another pillow to present to her upon her return. I called Joyce Jacob who was sewing some of the pillows together. She picked out a "happy" one and I got it to Jan to give to Nadiia. So the love of the little heart pillow continues thanks to the efforts of the Sewing Hearts Circle

Note: Thanks to the efforts of my cousin, Dr. Jan Massingill, through much effort she was able to sponsor Nadiia's daughter, Natasha, her husband, Dima, and his father to come to the USA!! They are in process trying to obtain their citizenships. Natasha is a brilliant mathematician and her husband had been a very successful businessman though everything he had was taken from him and he was imprisoned. How blessed we are to have such hard-working Believers anxious to become citizens of our great country.

P.S. Natasha's little girl, Sophia, was born a few months after her arrival in the USA.

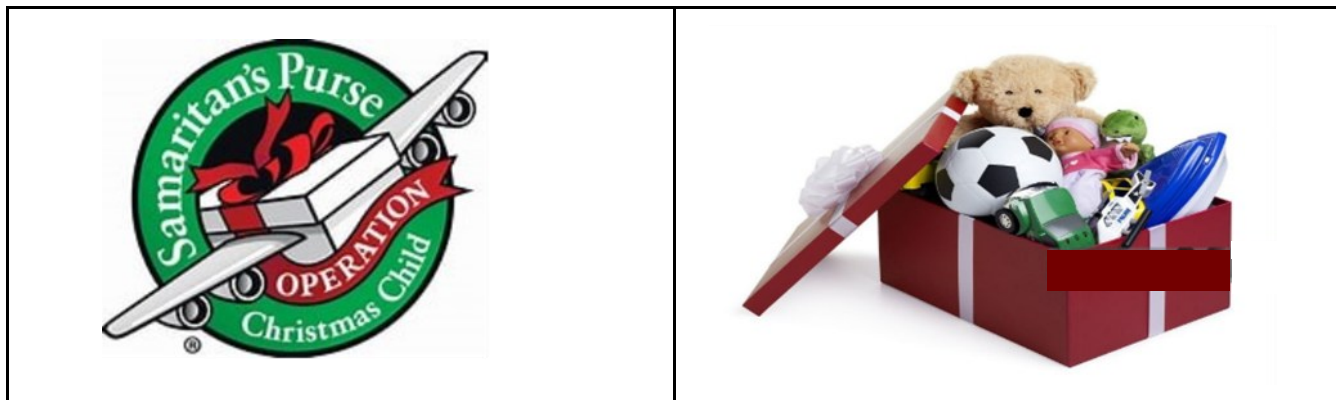

Czech Republic Mission

Spiritual Awakening in the Heart of Europe

Pražský hrad, the Prague Castle sits atop a hill overlooking the capital city of the Czech Republic. The castle has historically served as the residence for the kings of Bohemia, and is currently the residence and work place for the Czech president.



At the heart of this castle, which The Guinness Book of World Records has dubbed “the largest ancient castle in the world,” is a stunning and enormous gothic cathedral. Work for this cathedral was begun in 1340. As you walk the perimeter of the cathedral, the innumerable exquisite details begin to jump out—the gargoyles, the spires, the stained glass, the gold, the mosaic.

As I marveled the cathedral, I noticed an irony—namely, that at the heart of this castle, a symbol of the Czech Republic, stands a church. The irony is this, that God is very much not a part of the lives of your average Czech. You see, only 9-11% of Czechs consider themselves Christians. After years of religious suppression first under Nazi Germany and later under Communism, the church has not really “bounced back,” so to speak.

The Czech Republic might not be as obvious a mission field as other countries, however the poverty at the heart of the nation is undeniably real. To address this poverty, in 2025 DMC partnered with a church in Pilsen, Czech Republic to host an English language camp for middle and high schoolers. At camp, yes, we taught a full day of English lessons during the day, but the team shared their testimonies and sang hymns with the students in the evenings.

For some campers, it was their first time hearing the Good News of the Gospel. For some, it was their first time meeting actual Christians. Some believed. Some are still seeking and having conversations with their new American friends via WhatsApp. Lives were undoubtedly changed by the relationships forged at camp.

We are now enrolling campers for the 2026 YEC (Youth English Camp). We are excited that almost all our friends from last year plan on attending this year and many plan on bringing friends. Attendance could potentially double.

If you'd like to help, there are several ways to do so. Number one, pray that God would bring as many as possible to camp. Number two, pray that God would make ready the hearts of those in attendance to receive the good news of the gospel. Number three, if you find yourself in a position to give, you may do so by writing a check to Dahlenega Methodist Church and put Czech Mission in the memo. For those of you who have already given to our mission, I, on behalf of the team, would like to thank you for your support.
